This is a 12" block (12.5 unfinished) Colors are: Light beige for the background and any coordinating light and dark fall colored fabrics.

You can make as many blocks as you like, each block gets you 1 chance to win them all. So 2 blocks = 2 tickets, 3 blocks = 3 tickets, and so on. Bring your completed 12.5 inch blocks to the September meeting on September 13th.

It is so exciting to see who will win 12 blocks, and then to see, later on, what they will do with them. And it's even more exciting when we can have 2 and even 3 drawings, because we have so many blocks!

And just like any lottery—you have to enter to win!



More Quilt Show News: Just a reminder that we have Sue Harmon contracted to do quilt appraisals again at this show. She has been appraising quilts for close to 20 years. At our Guild Meeting in September I have a form Sue gave me to give anyone requesting an appraisal. It gives her general information about your quilt and if you have won any awards for your quilt. She has stated that written proof is required for insurance, fair market or donation values. Without an appraisal, most insurance companies will reimburse you for the replacement cost of a "blanket", less than \$20. If you have many quilts in your home, like I do, I believe it is wise to have a few of them appraised! Give me a call or an e-mail if you wish to sign up. Otherwise, I will be available at our September meeting to sign you up. Each appraisal costs \$50.00 I think we will have a raffle again at our September meeting. It will take 10 members at a cost of \$5.00 for one raffle drawing for an appraisal. Hope to hear from you!

We are so looking forward to hosting the 25+ Quilts from the Pilgrim and Roy Challenge, which will be on display at our quilt show!

The Pilgrim/Roy Invitational Quilt Challenge, named for Gerald E. Roy and the late Paul D. Pilgrim, is an annual quilt challenge sponsored by Hancock's of Paducah and Windham Fabrics.

Promising talented new and nationally known quilt makers are selected by Gerald E. Roy to participate in the annual challenge. Using only donated fabrics by the challenge's sponsors, plus one fabric of the artist's choice, quilt makers create unique and engaging wall quilts.

After opening each year at the annual AQS Quilt Show and Contest, in Paducah, Kentucky, the quilts travel for one year.

Following the exhibit's tour, the quilts are auctioned at the annual National Quilt Museum Benefit Auction. Chris Moline's collection represents a cross section of the many years this challenge has been in existence and includes items made by John Flynn, Karen Stone, Marsha McClosky, Shirley Kelly, Libby Lehman and other well known quilt makers.
